



HIKETHE CHANCE COVE BEACH WALKING TRAIL

Hike the [Chance Cove walking trail](#). It's located about an hour west of St Johns on the Isthmus Peninsula. LOCATE THE PUFFINS!

The official bird of our province. Puffins are the cutest little birds. For some reason I thought that they were larger but they are only about 12 inches high. There are a couple of different places to find them in NL but Bay Bulls, Bonavista near the lighthouse and Elliston are the best places! We found thousands of them on puffin island which is located right at the very end of the community of Elliston. You walk out about ten minutes to see them fluttering around. 

ONCE HERE, NEWFOUNDLAND'S TCH (TRANS-CANADA HIGHWAY) CONNECTS THE ENTIRE ISLAND, AND LABRADOR IS ACCESSIBLE VIA THE LABRADOR HIGHWAY (ROUTE 500).

🚗 PRO TIP: DISTANCES IN NEWFOUNDLAND & LABRADOR CAN BE MUCH LONGER THAN THEY APPEAR ON A MAP. ALWAYS FACTOR IN EXTRA DRIVING TIME AND FILL UP ON GAS WHEN YOU CAN, ESPECIALLY IN REMOTE AREAS!

- ✓ DRESS FOR THE WEATHER – NEWFOUNDLAND WEATHER IS UNPREDICTABLE! PACK LAYERS, A WATERPROOF JACKET, AND GOOD WALKING SHOES.
- ✓ DOWNLOAD OFFLINE MAPS – MANY AREAS HAVE LIMITED CELL SERVICE, SO DOWNLOAD GOOGLEMAPS OFFLINE BEFORE HEADING OUT.
- ✓ RESPECT WILDLIFE – KEEP A SAFE DISTANCE FROM MOOSE, WHALES, AND PUFFINS. DRIVE CAUTIOUSLY—MOOSE ARE COMMON ON HIGHWAYS!
- ✓ TRY THE LOCAL FOOD – DON'T LEAVE WITHOUT TASTING JIGGS' DINNER, TOUTONS, SEAFOOD, AND BAKEAPPLE JAM!
- ✓ EMBRACE THE LOCAL CULTURE – FROM KITCHEN PARTIES TO SCREECH-INS, NEWFOUNDLANDERS ARE KNOWN FOR THEIR HOSPITALITY—SO JOIN IN THE FUN!
